

# Fifth Sunday after Trinity - 4th July 2021

#### Read Mark 4.35-41

#### You may like to use this material as a basis for discussion in your family.

There is a lot of information in the media about climate change, pollution, and damage to plants and animals. People have not always looked after the earth and its resources as they should. What do you think are the main problems we face today?

This poem "Warned" by Sylvia Stults describes some of these problems and warns us that we should protect the earth's resources.



Today's Bible reading from St Mark's gospel describes how Jesus calmed the sea in a storm. The people who saw this said "Who is this who can command the wind and the sea to obey him?"

We can't control the wind and the sea like Jesus did. But the story of creation in the book of Genesis tells us that God created the world for us and made us stewards of the world. What does being a steward mean?

## Activity

- Make a Creation Wheel to remind yourself of the story from the book of Genesis
  about the creation of the world (Genesis 1.1-2.3). Go outside and make the shape
  of a seven-spoked wheel on the floor using twigs, as big as you like. You could do this
  on your own or as a family. The gaps in between are each one of the seven days of
  creation. Search for natural objects, and fill each segment with something which
  represents what was created on that day.
- Think about your meals this week try to have a meat-free day and eat only seasonal fruit and vegetables that have been grown in the UK, in order to cut down food miles.
- Find out about Greta Thunberg and what she has done to make people more aware of the issue of climate change.
