God, we pray for you to raise up a generation of leaders with the courage to take responsibility for our changing climate, and the part we have played in it. We intercede for our politicians and leaders – cause them to act in the best interests of all nations today, and all peoples' in the future, in order to avoid catastrophic changes. We ask for a generation of leaders who will be willing to act justly so that those who have contributed so little to the problems we are facing, and have fewer resources with which to face it, are not left to shoulder our burden.

Spirit of God, You established the dance of Creation; bring life out of death bring order out of chaos.
Call us to radical action: to care for the web of Creation to share our resources justly and to work for the renewal of our Mother, Earth.
